Veteran Warriors Summary of PCAFC Updates and Status

June 30, 2023

Highlights:

- Rulemaking *is* necessary to align the language and will be done as expeditiously as possible.
- No <u>current</u> participant (legacy <u>or</u> post-expansion) will be discharged <u>during</u> the rulemaking process <u>unless</u> due to cause. *Participants <u>may</u> need to qualify under a new regulation once published.
- ★ New PCAFC applications are being processed in real-time; decisions in less than 90 days.
- Artificial Intelligence (AI) is now being used to increase intake procedures for appeals.
- Respite Champions VA has 18 approved and 12 hired, increasing respite use and services.
- ★ Mental Health Hubs are now providing services to Caregivers.
- ♣ Program leadership continues to improve communication with the community via virtual and onsite listening sessions (80-90 visits completed) to seek consistency and best practices.

Program Status:

- New regulation info has <u>not</u> been disclosed.
- 🦫 Initial home visits and once-a-year Wellness visits will now resume in person.
- All eras are currently eligible to apply for PCAFC.
- \$\text{Staffing has been aggressive, 2,300 were hired; all but one VISN is at ~91% funded and in place.
- 🔖 Open CEAT Review/Consult are resolving in less than 30 days, except VISN 8 -still actively hiring staff

Mental Health Services for Caregivers:

- Mental Health (MH) Access to High-Quality Care and Caregiver Support, supported by Executive Order 14095, hopes to fully staff MH Hubs by the end of the calendar year 2023.
 - o Two hubs are set up, 82 Caregivers were enrolled within 2 months. ←This is POSITIVE!
 - o 54% of Caregivers requested telehealth counseling: marriage counseling, depression, and more.

Respite Services for Caregivers:

- Respite Champions VA has 18 approved and 12 hired, increasing respite use from 4% to 31%.
- There has been a 200% increase in VA Caregiver Program's respite "use" budget. ←This is POSITIVE!

Approved applications VISNs:

National average for application disposition within 90 days is 97%

Appeals:

- Submitting appeals more than once slows down the process; please only submit once.
- Legacu¹ Notice of Disagreement (Board) pending = 1,247 Dispositioned = 637 Granted = 21%
- ♣ Higher Level Review Appeals pending = 1,123 Dispositioned = 379 Granted = 11%
- Supplemental Claim Appeals pending = 1,659

 Dispositioned = 619 Granted = 13%
- AMA² Appeals Process Board pending = 3,892
 - ❖ The Board has not received any perfected legacy³ appeals relating to a PCAFC decision.

Survey (VSignal):

All scores above 90% except "Quality," noting Caregivers would like more inclusion by CEAT.

Improvements:

☑ Timelines for <u>intake procedures</u> as of today are 1-2 days for Higher Level Review, Supplemental Claims, and Board Appeals; see June 26, 2023 notice: https://bit.ly/pcafc-2023june-update-appeals

Opinions:

Dr. Richardson's primary goal <u>still appears to be to "do the right thing" by the community, all eras, without division</u>. Still room for improvement, but <u>we remain cautiously optimistic</u> the right person/people look to be in place to <u>help</u> the program get where it needs to be <u>if</u> given the reigns.
